Earned Income Exemptions

Non-disabled earners:

Single	\$50 + 25% of the next \$600 = Maximum \$200.00
Childless Couple	\$75 + 25% of the next \$800 = Maximum \$275.00
Families	\$125.00*

Disabled earners:

Single	\$100 + 25% of the next \$500 = Maximum \$225.00
Childless Couple	\$125 + 25% of the next \$700 = Maximum \$300.00
Families	\$200.00*

Other ministry programs to help lower income people:

The Saskatchewan Employment Supplement (SES) helps parents with the child-related costs of going to work. The supplement is provided to parents who receive income from work, self-employment and child or spousal maintenance. To qualify you must have children and combined income from these sources of over \$125 per month. To apply for the supplement please call 1-888-488-6385 or in Regina call 787-4723.

The Saskatchewan Rental Housing Supplement (SRHS) is a monthly payment that assists low-to-moderate income families and persons with disabilities with their monthly household rental costs. It is intended to help make quality housing more affordable for Saskatchewan residents. Family composition, location, and household income determine the size of the supplement. Rental properties must meet basic health and safety standards.

There are two components to the SRHS:

1. The Family Rental Housing Supplement provides benefits for low-to-moderate income families, with children under the age of 18, for their household rental costs.
2. The Disability Rental Housing Supplement provides benefits for low-to-moderate income single individuals, families and couples without children who have supports in their household to accommodate a disability-related need. The supplement is conditional upon supports that address the housing impact of the disability and must be in place at the time of the application.
